## **Singing Competitions**

Venue: Hampstead Garden Suburb Free Church, Central Square, NW11 7AG

### **Except where noted, the following information applies to all choir and singing competitions, including the Edith Poulsen Singing and Accompanists' Prize Competition**

All entrants may sing with or without instrumental accompaniment, but no backing tracks are allowed. If you wish to use the Festival's Official Accompanist, please indicate this when entering.

All entrants, but especially those with younger voices, should ensure they present vocally appropriate repertoire.

Entrants must provide the Adjudicator with a clean copy of the music for each work to be performed. Pieces may not be repeated in different competitions.

Entrants are reminded to introduce themselves and the piece(s) they are singing and to wear dress appropriate for a performance.

Entrants must be amateurs or music students and are reminded to introduce themselves and the piece(s) they are singing and to wear dress appropriate for a performance.

Where an age limit is specified, it is the **age on 1st September 2022** so that all the entrants in a class are in the same school year.

If an entrant has been a pupil of the Adjudicator in the year prior to the Festival or is well-known to the Adjudicator, they should contact the Section Head before entering.

We are grateful to **The Herbert Howells Society** for sponsoring a prize for the best performance of a song by Herbert Howells in any competition over the course of the Festival. The Herbert Howells Society Prize is £25 cash plus a copy of one of the books of Howells published songs chosen from a list supplied to the winner.



**200 and 201 — Edith Poulsen Singing and Accompanists' Prize  
Competition — Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April, from 10:00 am**

A **£500 cash prize** will be awarded to the highest placed **singer**.

A **cash prize of £300** will be awarded to the highest-placed **accompanist**.

The **singing** competition is open to singers who are studying as undergraduates or post-graduates, including those studying on an opera course, as well as those who have graduated from a conservatoire within the last three years.

The **accompanists'** competition is open to pianists who are studying as undergraduates or post-graduates, as well as those who have graduated from a conservatoire within the last three years.

Singers and accompanists should enter separately, noting on their entry if performing jointly:

**Singers:** competition 200 – entry fee £35,

**Accompanists:** competition 201 – entry fee £25

***Closing Date – Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023***

The **recital** can last up to 20 minutes. Entrants must sing one song from 4 of the 5 categories below, plus an optional 5th own-choice piece.

1. Early English or Italian song from the 16<sup>th</sup> or 17<sup>th</sup> centuries.
2. A song from the 19<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup> century sung in the original European language.
3. An aria from an opera, sung in the original language, with or without recitative.
4. An aria from an oratorio, sung in the original language, with or without recitative.
5. A 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> century English or American art-song or folksong.

Competitors will be adjudicated on the selection of a balanced and well-designed programme, on depth of their musicianship and on how they present themselves and connect with an audience. A verbal introduction to the musical programme is an integral part of the performance.

The **£500 cash prize** will be given in memory of **Edith Poulsen**, who was born in Vienna on 10 April 1918, arrived in London on 6 April 1939 as a refugee and passed away on 4 April 2020. Her grandfather first took her as a 7-year-old to see the opera Hansel and Gretel, and she became hooked, enjoying opera for the rest of her life. She was an annual visitor to Welsh National Opera, where her last visit was to see Hansel and Gretel, aged 97.

202	<b>Solo Recital</b> — 17 years and over, any voice. A competition for dedicated amateur singers of a high standard (comparable to Grade 7 and above), including those working towards conservatoire entry. A recital programme of two or three contrasting songs and arias.	15 mins	25.00
203	<b>Association of English Singers and Speakers (AESS) Prize</b> — 17 years and over, any voice. We are grateful to the AESS for sponsoring this competition. Two songs by British composers and one poem or piece of prose by a British poet or author performed in English. The candidate should introduce the programme and may choose the order in which to recite and sing. The songs and poem or prose should share a common theme. The AESS prize will be £25 cash, the AESS Trophy and a copy of one of the AESS' <i>Century of English Song</i> books. Class 203 will follow class 202.	15 mins	25.00
204	<b>Senior Early Music</b> — 16 years and over, any voice. One song from the Medieval, Renaissance or Baroque periods to be performed in the original language.	5 mins	15.00
205	<b>Oratorio</b> — 16 years and over, any voice. One aria from an oratorio, with or without recitative, to be sung in English or the original language.	7 mins	16.00
206	<b>Lieder/Melodie</b> — 16 years and over, any voice. One song by, for example, Brahms, Debussy, Duparc, Fauré, Hahn, Poulenc, Schubert, Schumann, R Strauss, or Wolf to be performed in the original language.	5 mins	15.00
207	<b>Adult Vocal Duet</b> — both performers 16 years and over, any voice. A duet from any opera, oratorio, operetta, musical or folk genre, original or arrangement. If you would like to sing a duet, but need help finding a partner, please indicate this when you enter.	7 mins	<b>10.00 per performer</b>



## Singing Day 2 – Musical Theatre, from 4:30 pm \* on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> March

For these classes, both the singing and the characterisation of the part are important. Costumes and props are welcome but, if used, should be simple.

212	<b>Junior Solo</b> — 12 to 15 years *.  One own-choice song from the classical repertoire. Class 212 will follow class 213.	4	14.00
213	<b>Children's Solo</b> — 11 years and under *.  One own-choice song from the classical repertoire. Class 213 will be at 4:30 pm.	3	14.00
214	<b>Junior Vocal Harmony</b> — 15 years and under *.  2 to 8 voices with one voice to a part. Any song from any genre. Class 214 will follow classes 213 and 212.	5	<b>7.00 per performer</b>
215	<b>Popular Song</b> — 15 years and under *.  To be performed with live instrumental accompaniment. No backing tracks allowed. Class 215 will follow classes 213, 212 and 214.	5	15.00

## Choirs and Ensembles

The 2023 competitions will be online, with choirs submitting a video of their performance rather than performing live. Every choir will receive a written adjudication sheet and a certificate of participation. Choirs from the UK and Ireland are welcome.

The overall winning choir will receive a **£200 cash prize**.

All entrants will be invited to a Zoom meeting on **Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May** to hear a general adjudication and selected performances. The Zoom will start at 4:30 with adjudication of class 252 for children's choirs, followed by class 251 and then 250.

There will be three choir classes:

251	<b>Young people's choir</b> aged 18 years * and under, any voice type, either unison or in parts, with a minimum of 6 voices. Two contrasting songs lasting no longer than 8 minutes in total. With or without accompaniment.	8	50.00
252	<b>Children's choir</b> aged 11 years * and under, any voice type, either unison or in parts, with a minimum of 6 voices. Two contrasting songs lasting no longer than 8 minutes in total. With or without accompaniment.	8	50.00
