## Rules

Speech and Drama

Notes for Teachers, Performers and Parents

- 1 Time limits given are the maximum allowed and will be strictly adhered to. The Adjudicator will stop adjudicating 10 seconds over the allotted time and the performance may be stopped. We will allow 2 minutes setting up time per group. If you go over this time it will be deducted from your allotted performance time.
- 2 Copies of pieces to be performed must be submitted to the Adjudicator before the start of the class.
- 3 All candidates are reminded that they are creating a performance. They should announce their pieces to the audience clearly and present themselves appropriately.
- 4 Simple costumes, make-up and props can be used, but no extra marks will be awarded for these. Chairs and tables will be available at the venue.
- 5 In all Group classes the age of the oldest competitor determines which class to enter. Age limits refer to the child's age on 1 Sept 2023.
- 6 Group classes are for three to eight players. If you wish to enter a smaller or larger group than this then please contact the Head of Speech and Drama.
- 7 VOLUNTEERS ARE ALWAYS NEEDED TO HELP ON THE DAY. IF YOU ARE INTERESTED AND CAN SPARE SOME HOURS PLEASE CONTACT THE HEAD OF SPEECH AND DRAMA.
