Competition Guidelines

The following guidelines apply to **all** the Festival's woodwind, brass and recorder, competitions.

Enter online via the Festival's website. The *Closing Date is Friday 22nd March.*

For each entry, age is the *age on 1st September 2023* so that the ages of entrants correspond to school years.

Entrants are reminded to introduce themselves and the piece(s) they are playing and to wear dress appropriate for a performance.

Pieces may not be repeated in different competitions.

Entrants must provide the Adjudicator with a clean copy of the music for each work to be performed.

If an entrant has been a pupil of the Adjudicator in the year prior to the Festival or is well-known to the Adjudicator, they should contact the Section Head before entering.
