## Competition Guidelines

The following guidelines apply to *all* the Festival's chamber music, ensemble, and folk music competitions, unless otherwise noted.

Enter these competitions online via the Festival's website.

The ***Closing Date is Friday 27 February.***

- For each entry dependent on age, it is the ***age on 1 September 2025*** that applies, so that all the entrants in any age-limited class are in the same school year or years.
- Entrants should introduce themselves and the piece(s) they are playing and wear dress appropriate for a performance.
- Except for folk music and world music, entrants must provide the Adjudicator with a clean copy of the music for each work to be performed.
- Pieces may not be repeated in different competitions.
- If an entrant has been a pupil of the Adjudicator in the 12 months prior to the Festival or is well-known to the Adjudicator, they should contact the Section Head before entering.
- The **Chamber Music Competitions** on Sunday 12 April are for small groups of up to ten players. Larger groups should enter one of the **Large Instrumental Ensemble** classes on Saturday 7 March.
- Chamber music groups may consist of any combination of instruments, including strings, wind, brass, and piano.
- Competitions on 7 March are for **orchestras and large instrumental ensembles** of more than ten players. The maximum number of players is 50 for class 511 and 30 for classes 512 and 513. - For orchestras and larger ensembles, there can be any combination of instruments, and the group may include an adult piano accompanist and/or a conductor. Two or more pieces should be played.

## Chamber Music Competitions

These competitions are for small groups of up to ten players. (Larger groups should enter one of the Large Instrumental Ensemble classes on Saturday 7 March.)

Chamber music groups may consist of any combination of instruments, including strings, wind, brass, and piano.

Only entries to classes 507 to 510 may have an adult piano accompanist and/or a conductor.

Stringers of London will award a £50 voucher to each player in the most outstanding string ensemble of up to 8 players.

A £50 cash prize, donated by Hilary Sturt, will be awarded to the **viola** player who makes the most outstanding contribution to their group's performance.

A £50 cash prize, in memory of David Angel, will be awarded to the **second violinist** who makes the most outstanding contribution to their group's performance.

## Large Ensembles, Orchestras, Folk Music, and World Music

Saturday 7 March

Venue: Hampstead Garden Suburb Free Church, Central Square, NW11 7AG

**Adjudicator: Paul Hoskins**

Competitions 511, 512 and 513 are for orchestras and large ensembles of more than ten players. The **maximum** number of players is **50** for 511 and **30** for 512, 513, 520 and 521.

If you wish to enter a larger group than these limits, please first contact the Section Administrator.

There can be any combination of instruments, and the group may include an adult piano accompanist and/or a conductor. Two or more pieces should be played.

A shield may be awarded to the highest marked ensemble from either class 512 or class 513 or the Folk Music class 515.

Class 511 will be at 11:30. Class 521 will start at 14:00 followed by all the other classes.
